Warm up Exercises

Answer True or False in each case

1.	A player may not look at the face of any card played and turned down after he has turned his own card face down.	
2.	You are allowed to inspect your own last card played only as long as no card has been led to the next trick.	
3.	You can give permission to your partner to touch your cards after play has finished.	
4.	Dummy may try to prevent an opponent's lead out of turn.	
5.	If you realise that you have given a wrong explanation of your partner's call – you should call the TD immediately and offer a correct explanation.	
6.	Dummy can correct declarer's mistaken review of the auction.	
7.	Declarer can require that any card pointed incorrectly is pointed correctly at anytime.	
8.	Dummy may not call the Director.	
9.	Declarer can ask for a review of the auction before he plays his first card from his hand.	
10.	A defender can ask about the meaning of a call made by dummy or declarer during the play of the hand.	

11.	Defender may not show Dummy his hand.	
12.	North is dealer and opens 1NT. E/W are counting their cards but have not looked at them. The auction period has started for both sides.	
13.	Dummy or declarer can look at his own convention card after the final pass and before the opening lead is faced.	
14.	Dummy can dispute a defender's claim.	
15.	Dummy must ensure that dummy follows suit.	
16.	Dummy can ask a defender if that defender has failed to follow suit.	
17.	Players are obliged to offer an explanation for their partner's calls even if there is no agreed meaning.	
18.	Dummy remains dummy until the score has been agreed by both sides.	
19.	An obvious scoring error can be corrected after expiry of the correction period.	
20.	If North has seen his 14 cards. No one has called and the extra card belongs to South. The TD will allow the board to be played.
