





The hand with shape should act over 1NT but here  $2 \bigstar$  showing five spades and a minor might not be everyone's choice vulnerable. In the modern game South should not double which would be negative, but he should be very happy if the opponents choose to play a spade partial down two or three tricks vulnerable. It won't come as a great surprise to him that West would rather play in his partner's minor and now South could chance a double which would suggest that he had a penalty double of spade from his inaction on the first round.  $3 \bigstar$  is the call he does not want to hear from partner but maybe partner can pass for penalty or bid  $3 \clubsuit$ both of which would be welcome developments. On the actual deal  $3 \clubsuit$  doubled would be one down on trump leads for a top for North-South but even  $3 \checkmark$  which should be a comfortable make should be a little above average.

Even though the suit is weak, with an eighth club the vulnerable pre-empt is reasonable. South could try 3 ◆ but it is a bit committal with such a poor suit and relative strength in the majors so double is preferred. West can boost the pre-empt leaving North with the final guess. He can double showing general strength, get greedy by trying his four card major (certainly doesn't work well here) or try his best suit. 5 ◆ makes if you play well. After a club lead to the ace and queen, heart switch, win the ace in dummy and play a diamond discovering that East has the guarded king. Now you have to eliminate the majors to endplay East. The percentage is play two rounds of your shorter major first, here spades and once you do that on the actual lie you are home. Continue with ♥K and then a third round of spades and if East doesn't ruff throw him in with a diamond to give you a ruff and discard to dispose of your heart loser.

In the suggested auction, East's 2\* shows the majors and 2\* asks for the longer major. You shouldn't be thinking of higher contracts with the West cards as you have no fitting honours for partner's suits and he may well have been bidding most of your cards for you with his initial action! In 2\* declarer will lose two trumps and the pointed suit kings for an overtrick.

This hand may turn out to be a minefield for strong no-trumpers, you could imagine an auction that starts 1. P-P-X-P-P. North with Kx in his partner's suit may not think of running from one 1. doubled but as is often the case when a one level contract is doubled it is a good idea to try and find another spot. Here both 1. and 2. will cost 300 which won't be great but better than the 800 possible in 1. If North tries 1NT in response to his partner's opening, then a double by East for take-out converted to penalties by his partner is possible.

East should definitely be opening in third seat especially if his 1\* opening is natural for the lead directional benefit. Secondly look at how much more difficult it is for the opponents to bid a slam with confidence. If you pass, South opens 1\* and his partner can either splinter with 4\* (particularly attractive opposite a five-card major opening) or go the more cautious route with a three level limit raise. Either route should lead to the small slam being bid. After a 1\* opening, South has to start with a double and now West can boost the pre-emption with 3\*. The focus is now on North, you are really a bit strong for 3\* which might be competing on far less values and here would probably lead to the slam being missed. Therefore, you have to go the more aggressive route of either jumping to 4\* or bidding 4\*, offering partner a choice of games.

Vulnerable, with only 11 aceless HCP, opening is a little rich for me, especially when you have the boss suit and thus are less likely to be stolen from in the auction. Opening will surely lead to the doomed spade game which if East leads his singleton looks to be at least two off. If South is left to open in third seat an interesting competitive auction could develop. I prefer  $1 \checkmark$  to 1NT opposite a passed hand as it caters to a fit in either major better. West shouldn't even be thinking about overcalling with a five-card suit, minimal points and weak length in the suit opened in front of him. However, he can try to push them when they alight in a fit at a low level which he knows is breaking badly.

The hand illustrates the perils of protecting one of a major without a good holding in the other major. Yes, North won't play South for a good hand if he tries 2 • but this will give West the chance to make a take-out double and the far superior heart fit will be unearthed. Against 1 •, North leads a club and declarer wins and to escape for one down declarer has to cash his two heart winners before starting on the trump suit.

If he fails to do this, North will be able to discard a heart on the fourth round of clubs when declarer ruffs in, which should lead to down with accurate defence. Holding heart contracts to nine tricks should be easy enough as South has an obvious club lead, whilst if East is declarer North should be able to find the club switch if he starts with the A.

The 1\* opening is marginal at the prevailing vulnerability but you do have a 5-4 shape and crisp honour cards. North may well respond by bidding what he thinks he can make and here he would be right as after two top clubs have been cashed he will have the rest. An aggressive East might try 5, but with defensive cards in the opponent's suits that is not clear. If North tries a slower approach and responds at the one level, then East can overcall in diamonds and then, when partner shows some support, the save is much more likely to be found. With only the three aces to take against 5. North-South will have to push onto the five level to ensure a reasonable score, and I can see South with his minimum opener and what looks like three quick tricks against the opponents contract doubling, although should he pass North with a partial fit in clubs and no diamonds at all is likely to chance the five level.

At favourable vulnerability South may well poke his nose into the auction leaving little room for East-West to explore for the best contract. Left to his own devices West can transfer to hearts and then bid 3NT leaving partner to decide. After the overcall, double, (in the modern style for take-out) the most flexible choice, leaving all of 4, 3NT and 3 doubled in play. Here East should try 3NT, with a double stop in the suit overcalled and a source of tricks in clubs that looks much more attractive than trying to defeat South by four tricks to show a profit against a vulnerable game making. Indeed, against the best lead of a trump versus 3 declarer still has six easy tricks and if West leads anything else, declarer can do a trick better. A 3NT contract is likely to make 10 tricks after a spade lead, the double dummy route required to make 11 tricks is rather incredible to say the least, as you will appreciate if you take the time to work out what you have to do.

The 1A opening is not something to be proud of but at least we are not vulnerable, however, after the overcall and pre-emptive raise by South, West will be left few options other than 3NT, which happens to be the best strain for his side, despite the best efforts of the opposition to push him around. After a spade lead to queen, South tries a heart finesse, when this loses North is marked with the remainder of his points for the opening bid, so declarer should have no trouble coming to twelve tricks. 6 + makes but isn't a great spot with a certain heart loser and a hole in the trump suit and some more work to do. I can't see more than a handful of pairs reaching it since either if North passes initially 1 - P - 2 - 2 - 3 + doesn't feel like an auction that is going to finish at the six level.

If East opens either a weak no-trump or  $1 \checkmark$ , then the likely result is that South will end up declaring  $3 \blacklozenge$  after his partner has shown the minors with an unusual no-trump bid. The best lead for the defence is a trump (often the case when one hand has shown a big two suiter). Declarer just about survives, he wins and ducks a club. The defence plays a second trump, declarer ruffs a club but the A drops on the third round for nine tricks. On a non-trump lead declarer should make ten tricks by ruffing two clubs. If East passes, then South will open a weak  $2 \checkmark$ , over which nobody will bid. Curiously this may be okay for South, as to defeat  $2 \checkmark$  the defence need to lead an unlikely diamond. After the normal looking A lead, declarer will be a tempo ahead of the defence.

The age-old question whether to double or overcall in the long suit with 5-4 in the majors rears its head here. In this instance with the hearts being so strong relative to the spades, I think the double is clear. This could pave the way to an interesting competitive auction, with South rebidding 1NT (a good 17-19 HCP and making incidentally unless the defence starts with an unlikely three rounds of clubs). West can compete in hearts and maybe North will judge well to compete with his diamond fit and well placed king opposite his partner once he has shown strength.

South's club stop isn't so wonderful so he should use fourth suit forcing to check whether his partner has three hearts before committing to no-trumps. If North passes initially then it is possible that some pairs miss game especially if North responds to  $2 \diamond$  to his partner's  $1 \checkmark$  opening.

The cards lie very well for declarer, and where East is on lead, only a heart lead doesn't present declarer with another trick immediately. You could imagine for instance 49 to the ace followed by a diamond to the 10 and another diamond which gives declarer three tricks in each minor and two in each major with the aid of a finesse. Indeed, you could imagine nine tricks in no-trumps being below average.
