Prizes in 2019

Heat winners: There will no longer be a prize draw for the heat winners from each club. The budget for these prizes has been added to that for the overall winners.

Overall winners: The overall winners of all Simultaneous Pairs events hosted by the English Bridge Union will each receive a cash prize of £100 per pair. This is an increase from £50 in 2018. The winners of the Bridge England Sims and the Club Stratified Sims will also receive this prize – these events were previously excluded from the prizes.


Host clubs: Every affiliated club which enters a heat of any EBU organised event, will be included in a random draw. One 'entry' in the draw is awarded for every ten tables (or part thereof) which take part in any single heat. The draw will be made at the AGM in November. 




South has a nice hand facing a no-trump opening, but not quite nice enough for slam purposes. You might have your favourite way of showing a hand with 5-5 in the majors, but simply to show both suits works well enough on this hand. After spades are agreed, South cue-bids, but North does not cooperate. In practice hearts plays better than spades here, as in nearts, declarer can discard two of South's spades, on the K and K, thus making 11 tricks. In spades declarer will surely lose a spade trick as well as two minor-suit aces.

n fourth seat North opens a 4-card heart suit on his hand that is too strong for a weak NT. South raises to 2♥. I think North needs 17 HCP to bid on with only a 4-card suit, and here there is no reason for him to upgrade. 2♥ becomes the final contract. I would lead a low trump from the East hand. Maybe declarer would win in dummy and play a low club to his king. Perhaps another trump now, and East wins the ♥A and plays another. Declarer wins n dummy and plays another club, thus setting up a winner for a spade discard. West takes this and plays a spade but declarer rises with the ♠A, cashes a club throwing a spade. He now plays a diamond. If West plays the ♥Q ne ducks, and if West plays low he wins the ♦A and plays another. This makes sure he loses his first diamond to East who cannot attack spades profitably.

With trumps 4-1, declarer needs to stop drawing them and turn his attention to diamonds, but with the actual layout West cannot get a ruff.
