



East may give up a tempo with a diamond lead, but declarer still cannot make a spade trick or extra heart without help, and could finish two light. North can actually make eight tricks, even on a passive lead, cashing clubs, then giving up a diamond. West eventually has to cede an extra trick in the majors. 			 West could respond 1NT or a thin 2♣ to east's 1♦, but north will be there with 2♠. It looks more likely that east will bid or support clubs rather than look for a no trump spot with his seemingly vulnerable spade holding. Today, 3NT is there when clubs lie ideally and the diamond 10 falls. However, I can see few actually declaring this spot, though those that respond 2♣ might find themselves propelled into the game. The same nice club lie allows ten tricks to score in clubs, but this will have to take second fiddle to any declaring no trumps.
